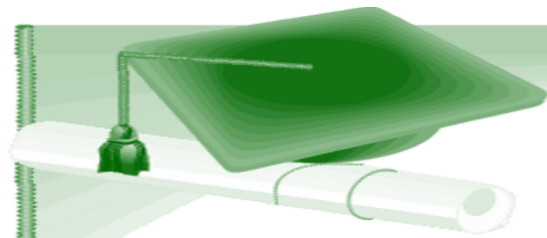

The PTO is sponsoring Field Day so students can have a fun day with their friends before everyone leaves for the summer.

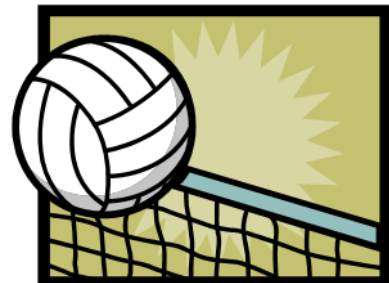
Please note the following dress code for Field Day:

As you may know, the PTO is sponsoring a field day for our children on Monday, May 23rd, as a way to reward them for their hard work this year. The plans for this day include:

8:00 - 9:00 - Set Up
9:00 - 12:00 - Outside Games
12:00 - 1:00 - Lunch
1:00 - 3:00 - Inside Games
3:00 - Back to Homeroom

In the morning, students will be divided into teams that will stay together, with 2 adults staying with them as they rotate through the outside games.

We plan to have apples, bananas, oranges, Gatorade and water available for the children during the outside games.

Lunch will be hot dogs with chips and cookies (or bring your own lunch if you prefer). During lunch, volunteers will be setting up in the gym for the afternoon cool-down games.
